
Money Confident Kids
















Class Spotlight: 6th Grade

MCAP Test-Taking Tips

Grades 3 to 8 are taking the Maryland Comprehensive Assessment Program (MCAP) assessments to provide you and our teachers important benchmarks to inform instruction and provide support. Here are tips for your student to be MCAP ready. Visit support.mdassessments.com for MCAP details

- 1. Get a good night's sleep the night before (in bed by 9 PM).
- 2. Eat a healthy breakfast on testing days.
- 3. Get to school on time. Being rushed/late adds anxiety to the day.
- 4. Relax during test taking. Deep breathing helps!
- 5. Read the entire question first before answering.
- 6. Underline keyword/phrases in the question and look for them in the passage.
- 7. Try your best. That voice inside of your head during the test is usually right!
- 8. Instead of negative self-talk, say "I've been working hard and will do my best!"
- 9. Focus on your own work, not how quickly others finish.

The Baltimore Curriculum Project (BCP) Board of Directors is a dedicated group of professionals who provide governance, oversight, and strategic direction for BCP's network of charter schools. The board is composed of leaders from various fields, including education, business, law, and community advocacy, all committed to supporting high-quality public education in Baltimore.

The Board provides oversight of BCP schools' academic performance, financial stability and stewardship, and compliance with charter school regulations. The Board sets long-term goals and priorities to drive continuous improvement and collaborates with school principals and BCP leadership to enhance student outcomes. The Board also advocates for BCP schools with policymakers, community leaders, and stakeholders.

A member of the U.S. House of Representatives since 2019, Congresswoman Omar (Dem.) represents Minnesota's 5th congressional district. Prior to serving in Congress, she served in the Minnesota House of Representatives. She is the deputy chair of the Congressional Progressive Caucus and is the first Somali American to be elected to Congress, the first woman of color to represent Minnesota, and one of the first two Muslim U.S. Congresswomen along with Rashida Tlaib.
