Mr. O reaches out to every high school our 8th grade Scholars are set to attend and collaborates with members of their leadership team to identify a book they would like their incoming Scholars to read. This book may be part of their summer assignments or will be explored in 9th grade.

Every 8th grader gets a copy of the selected book and an individualized assignment to work on in order to help them get "high school ready." The books vary from *Romeo and Juliet* to *Animal Farm* and *To Kill a Mockingbird*. This special unit is something unique to the City Springs experience and is a beneficial way to get Scholars motivated and excited for high school, while also engaging them in meaningful work at the end of the academic year.

## Field Trip Fun!

We are ending our year with amazing local and regional adventures! On May 15, the 2<sup>nd</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grade attended the Orioles vs. the Minnesota Twins, and Pre-K through 1st Grade explored the nature and history of Baltimore's 200-acre Patterson Park. Did you know that there have been over 220 species of birds spotted in the Park?

### **Preventing Summer Learning Loss**

Summer break is a wonderful time for kids to relax, explore new interests, and recharge. Research shows that in July and August, many students experience a setback or "summer slide" in academic skills, especially in math and reading. Students can return to school having forgotten what they learned, spending precious months catching up instead of moving ahead.

Preventing this loss is key to ensuring your child starts the next grade confident and ready to learn. Here are simple, enjoyable, free (or low-cost) activities to keep your child's brain engaged all summer long:

**Reading for Pleasure:** Encourage your child to read daily—just 15 minutes a day can make a big difference. Let them pick books they enjoy, whether it's comics, fantasy, or nonfiction. Chatting about stories together will deepen their understanding and make reading more meaningful.

Writing in a Journal: Keeping a daily journal is a great way to build writing skills. Your child can write about their day no matter their age. Older scholars can write stories or write about their day. Young learners can draw pictures and write words. A special notebook they can decorate with fun pens or crayons can make this more exciting.

**Playing Math Games:** Free online games make practicing math facts and problem-solving fun and interactive. Older kids might enjoy Khan Academy with lessons tailored to their level. Let your child choose favorite sites or games to keep them motivated with a goal of two to three games.

Make Learning Fun and Child-Led: Children are more likely to stick with learning activities when they have a say in what they do. Visiting the public library is a fantastic way to offer variety. Kids can explore different books, participate in summer reading challenges, and even get advice from librarians.

The most important thing parents can do is to support and encourage your child. Parents are the first and most valuable teacher your child has. Show interest in the books they read, ask about their journal entries, and join in on math games. Your involvement sends a powerful message that learning is valuable and enjoyable.

Even a few minutes a day can make a big impact!

On June 19, 1865, 250,000+ enslaved people in Galveston, Texas received news of their emancipation. Following the Civil War, Black Americans celebrated Juneteenth with religious services, storytelling, singing, games, and the tradition of throwing garments worn during enslavement into a river to symbolize freedom from bondage. On June 17, 2021, President Joe Biden signed the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act, making it a federal holiday.
