# MCAP Testing

This month, we are administering The Maryland Comprehensive Assessment Program (MCAP) for grades 3-8. This is a mandatory annual statewide testing program that measures student proficiency in mathematics and English Language Arts. There are many ways to help your student prepare for the MCAP.

## MCAP Test-Taking Tips

Always read instructions carefully and completely to understand what to do.

Read the full passage before answering.

Eliminate wrong answers first. Skip difficult questions to complete later.

Never leave a question blank -- there is no penalty for guessing.

Get enough sleep for test days. Eat a healthy breakfast.

Help manage students' anxiety about testing -- it's OK to feel nervous.

Do your best! Students have worked hard to prepare and they are ready!

Be positive about the MCAP. Your attitude influences your student's attitude.

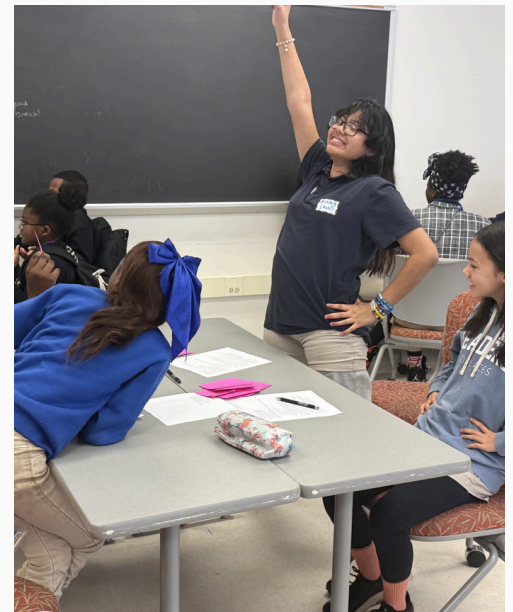

Ilhan Omar (born 1982) is a U.S. Representative (D-Minnesota). As war refugees from Somalia, she and her family moved to Minnesota, and she became a U.S. citizen. When she was elected to Congress in 2018, she became the first Muslim woman to serve there. She champions fairness, justice, and equal rights for all and works on issues like education, healthcare, and helping families.
